Justification for course proposal:

The purpose of this proposal is to remove the prerequisite of FASH 31. No any other changes are made to the class.

In the recent catalogs including the current 2020-2021 catalog (see the attachment 1), FASH 31 does not have a prerequisite. In the Curriculum Workflow, FASH 31 (previously FACS 31 Textiles) does not have a prerequisite either (see the attachment 2 and 3). However, during Spring 2020 when students were ready to register for Fall 2020, some students reported that FASH 31 has a prerequisite stated as 'Only FACS majors/minors may enroll in this course.' The FACS Department reached out to the Office of the University Registrar and was told that in their system, the FACS majors/minors requirement is still in place as the prerequisite for FASH 31.

FASH 31 does not need to have the prerequisite because it is a lower division course open to FASH majors and any other majors who are interested in fashion. The capacity of the class has been able to meet the demand. This has been correctly reflected in the Curriculum Workflow and the current catalog. However, due to some system error, the Office of the University Registrar still has the old paper document from 2015 in place. They recommended to submit a Form A to remove the prerequisite (see the attachment 4) in order to fix the error.

It is unclear to the FACS Department why in the Workflow FASH 31 does not have prerequisites, but the prerequisite is still in place at the Office of the University Registrar.

This proposal is simply to straighten up the inconsistency of FASH 31 prerequisite by following the Office of the University Registrar's recommendation.
