Title of the Program: Minor in South and Southeast Asian Studies

#### Designation: (degree terminology)

#### Abstract of the proposal:

The minor will introduce students to the general area of Asian Studies through one introductory required course (ASIA 1), and to the region including South and Southeast Asia through our Asian Migration course (ASIA 111), which will be taught regularly by our new faculty. Then, students may take 12 units on South and Southeast Asian Studies, including language courses.

\*NOTE: We are currently making substantive program revisions in Asian Studies, formulating new courses and changing our major and minor. Currently, no general Asian Studies BA exists. We have 4 BA degrees by concentration: Chinese, Japanese, Korean, South and Southeast Asian (36 units). To clarify the variety of changes in the Asian Studies Program, I am summarizing below what we are doing.

(1) We are creating a new general Asian Studies BA (39 units).

(2) We are creating new Asian Studies (ASIA) coded courses to fulfill the requirements and create new electives.

(3) New courses include: ASIA 1 (required for major and minor), ASIA 111 (elective, required for minor). Revised courses: ASIA 198 (required for major and minor)

(4) We will discontinue the 4 concentrations as soon as possible.

(5) We are revising our current Minor in Asian Studies from 24 to 18 units. Now, two ASIA coded pan-Asia courses will be required, many optional electives remain.

(6) We are migrating the curriculum of the concentrations to proposed 18-unit minors.

(7) The concentrations in Korean Studies and South/Southeast Asian Studies will become minors.

(8) The concentrations in Chinese and Japanese Studies may become minors; currently discussions with interested faculty are taking place.

#### Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:

Asian Studies currently offers a BA in Asian Studies with a Concentration in South and Southeast Asian Studies. We are discontinuing our regional concentrations but wish to reformulate it as a minor. There is strong interest in South and Southeast Asia on our campus and in the community. We currently have about 5 students majoring in the South and Southeast Asian concentration and anticipate such students will instead choose to adopt the minor, perhaps paired with an Asian Studies major or a separate major. We also think students with interest in South and Southeast Asia but who did not wish to major in Asian Studies may choose to take a minor instead. We believe this minor will help maintain enrollment in Punjabi language courses and facilitate interest in our courses and our major.

#### Objectives of the degree program:

The minor is designed to augment students interest in another subject but who have a particular interest in South and Southeast Asia, whether through business, culture, heritage, etc. This minor offers regional specific content and we anticipate a growth in students seeking the minor and taking courses in the program.

## **Program Description**

The minor offers students a framework to explore South and Southeast Asia from an interdisciplinary perspective, examining the religion, culture, and history of peoples and countries in the region such as Afghanistan, India, and Pakistan, and further east to Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam and others. Students will be introduced to the broader region through two pan-Asia courses before selecting area studies electives to fit their own interest.
