We are proposing three changes:

- 1. Faculty in the program would like to change the title of the course to reflect recent advances in the field.
- 2. We no longer need a 'C/F' designation because the content has been combined; there will no longer be a separate lecture (C) and discussion (F). The units for the course will total 2 because the prior lecture and discussion were one unit each. We are deleting EDSS 364F.
- 3. The 'L' at the end of the course numbering (EDSS 364L) indicates a specialized section that is part of a certificate for Linked Learning. Only students who are participating in the specialized certificate program will be allowed to enroll in the EDSS 364L course; all others will be in the EDSS 364 course.
