Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:
The ENVS BA includes an area for Inter-disciplinary electives. Students must choose 2 courses (for a total of 6 units) from other Departments. The purpose of this proposal is to update the list of acceptable courses to include the new course in Global Environmental History, HIST 139A, alongside HIST 165.
The objective of the change is two-fold:

1. to not unnecessarily constrain entry into the ENVS Major, and
2. provide students greater flexibility and diversity in their learning about environmental studies by the inclusion of the social sciences (e.g., politics, economics) and humanities (e.g., history) and how they are applied applied in Environmental Studies.

This insert will also help our program meet 4 and 5 of its learning objectives (listed below in the "Objectives of the degree program").
