Our only change to this course comes because we incorrectly filled out the "Course Component and Classification" section in the original proposal: the "Course Component and Classification" should be changed from CS12 to CS78. No other changes to the course are proposed here. Faculty collect artifacts that students produce; faculty do so by using a standardized Canvas (LMS) course that guides students as the students independently produce a portfolio of their work and reflections. Faculty do not lecture, create assignments, evaluate/assess work, or do course development; all faculty use the standardized Canvas course. This new classification (CS78) more accurately reflects the faculty role in the course.
