Justification for course proposal:

This course is replacing the experimental course INTD 196 which proved to be a successful alternative to the difficulties and inequities in requiring Interior Architecture students to complete a professional internship. Due to the pandemic and other factors, students were receiving an unequal education based on their inability to secure an internship, and on the lack of opportunities provided by internship sponsors. The feedback from running the experimental course in Spring 2021, and this Fall 2021 semester has been that students are better prepared for their future due to a stronger portfolio, and better understanding of how to get a job in the design and architectural field. Additionally, the online professional lecture series has proved to be a positive and helpful networking experience for both students and local firms.

This class is a permanent replacement for INTD 181, Interior Graphics IV (Portfolio) (1 unit) & INTD 195 Professional Practice IV (Internship) (3 units). A program change reflecting this shift is forthcoming. This course will provide a more robust pre-professional preparation for all of our students. Within this course, students will evaluate and revise their previous creative work and design multiple platforms on which they can showcase it to the professional community. This course will also allow more collaboration opportunities with campus resources in career services, as well as community outreach to local and national professional organizations. In addition, the lecture series and firm tours will expose our students to networking opportunities in order to better prepare them in applying for professional jobs in the field of architecture and design or for application to graduate-level education in architecture and design. In short, this course provides all students with the pre-professional insight needed prior to graduation to better prepare them for success in finding professional employment in the design and architecture field.
