Justification for course proposal:

This course is replacing the experimental course, INTD 96, which proved successful in addressing a registration bottleneck in the Lower Division course sequence of the BFA Interior Architecture program. This course acts as a substitution to previously required INTD 27 and INTD 30, which needed to be taken over two semesters as INTD 30 was a prerequisite to INTD 27. INTD 35 combines the coursework and learning outcomes of those courses into one 5-unit course. As there are very few articulation agreements with community college for these courses, this is particularly helpful for transfer students to reduce the time to graduation.

Exploration of design and space planning fundamentals and their use in creating architectural interiors, as well as an introduction to the principles and techniques of architectural drafting. Through a series of design problems students will engage with basic space planning concepts and vocabulary as well as CAD drawing skills and conventions.
