This will be a required course as part of a pathway for Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) students who already have a bachelor's degree in another field to transition directly into the Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) program at Sacramento State, enabling them to complete the MSN in four, six or eight semesters. This course in conjunction with another proposed course, NURS 181, will fulfill missing components typically addressed in a Bachelor of Science in nursing program to prepare students for Master's education.

This course provides an introduction to the role of the nurse leader by exploring theoretical and ethical concepts, professional communication, and evidence-based practice. Students will undertake critical analysis of nursing practice and healthcare systems with a focus on professional role development.

Discussion board postings and class discussion assignments. There are two discussion board assignments and two class discussion assignments that require students to engage in thoughtful discussion while answering prompts the role of the professional nurse leaders. Students will post and respond to peers for the discussion board posts and will engage with peers and faculty for the class discussion assignments.

The class discussion assignments are on: The role of the nurse (ELO 1) Nursing Theorists (ELO 2)

The discussion board posts are on:

Annotated bibliography (ELO 4) (Using databases to conduct searches for peer-reviewed articles on a chosen topic and providing a critical summary of one article and post your Annotated Bibliography summary in a discussion board. Respond to two peers about their summaries.)

Ethical concerns and the role of the nurse (ELO 1, 2) (Respond to a prompt regarding an ethical concern that affects the nurse leader. Include an ethical principle and citation in your post and respond to two peers.)

APA and Scholarly Writing Assignment (ELO 1, 3)- The APA and Scholarly Writing Assignment will allow students to construct a paper using APA 7th edition format. They will write a brief (two-page) paper providing as summary of the roles of Baccalaureate-prepared Nurse Leaders and Masters-prepared nurse leaders. They will include citations in APA format to support their examples. Additionally, they will reflect on their future goals as a masters-prepared nurse. Personal Nursing Theory Writing Assignment (ELO 2)- In this assignment, students will write a paper that will discuss their own nursing practice through the lens of a nursing theory, framework, or conceptual model that the student selects. In this paper students will provide a description of the selected nursing theory, framework or conceptual mode and how the selected theory, framework, or conceptual model applies to the students' own nursing practice. Students will support their paper with in-text citations in APA format.

The Role of the Nurse Leader Presentation and Peer review (ELO 1, 3,4)-The Role of the Nurse Leader Assignment is a presentation with written and oral components. In this assignment, students will use evidence-based sources to describe the role of nurse leaders in a specific health setting. Additionally, students will respond to peers about their presentations.
