This course is being modified to fit with upcoming changes in program requirements (form B expected Fall 2022); a significant portfolio project that becomes part of a student's e-portfolio is being added to the course and the number of units changed appropriately (4-unit course). The modification enhances students' college-to-career prospects by improving professional writing skills and by accelerating time-to-degree. The modification alleviates course bottlenecks in the Spanish major and minor without adding significant units. These changes are modeled on the success of similar curricular modifications in the English department. For this course, students will write approximately 5000-6500 words, including 3500-5000 words of formal academic prose as part of their e-portfolio.
