The Social Science Faculty Council is proposing a variety of changes which seek to achieve the following:

1) Broaden the course offerings of core major and major elective requirements to allow for more interdisciplinarity and facilitate progress toward a minor/double major.
2) Broaden course offerings to reflect changing curriculum in the programs offering courses in the major currently.
3) Require that students complete a capstone experience (SSCI 193). Currently, this is only a requirement of the Subject Matter Program in Social Science. The proposed changes would require this course for all majors.
4) Align the degree requirements with the Subject Matter Program in Social Science.

## Objectives of the degree program:

The Social Science major is offered by the departments of Anthropology, Economics, Ethnic Studies, Geography, History, Political Science, Sociology, and Women's and Gender Studies. It serves as an interdisciplinary major that allows students to examine interconnectedness across social science disciplines. The degree program also provides subject matter preparation for the Single Subject Teaching Credential in Social Science.
