Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:

We are requesting that two additional program modalities, Online and Hybrid, be added to the existing in-person BS in Nutrition and Food (NUFD) degree. The NUFD program is invested in offering multiple modalities to meet student needs and learning preferences to enhance student success, improve graduation rates, and be more student focused.

A NUFD student survey was conducted in early spring 2022 (n=78) and 85% of students indicated they would like to complete their degree with online courses or a combination of online and in-person (hybrid) courses. Students stated that online or hybrid degree modality could offer.

- -flexibility,
- -cost savings (commuting, childcare, gas, parking),
- -more time to study, care for children, and better work-life balance,
- -ability to complete degree faster, and
- -more time for internships.

By offering in-person, online and hybrid class options, students will be better able to take courses that align with their learning style and match their schedule needs.

The NUFD program can offer each required course in-person and online frequently enough to allow efficient degree completion (see attachment). The NUFD faculty who will be teaching the online courses are trained and have experience applying Quality Matters (QM) strategies to promote student engagement and success.

This proposal will not increase the need for additional resources and no other program changes are being requested at this time.

Objectives of the degree program:

- 1. Demonstrate scientific knowledge of fundamental skills, values, resources, current trends, theories, and issues relating to the utilization of food for human growth and metabolism from the interdisciplinary perspective in Dietetics, Food Administration and Nutrition
- 2. Demonstrate effective communication skills: a) as individuals and collaborators, b) in written and verbal forms, c) in delivery and receipt directions, d) including the use of current technology in the field of Dietetics, Food Administration and Nutrition.
- 3. Analyze and critique information for effective problem solving and scientific evidence in the field of Dietetics, Food Administration and Nutrition.
- 4. Apply and evaluate key values as individuals and describe how ethics and values are applied in the field of Dietetics, Food Administration and Nutrition.
- 5. Examine how multiple perspectives from other disciplines, societies, individuals, groups and cultures influence issues relating to the utilization of food for human growth and metabolism, as well as interdisciplinary science in the field of Dietetics, Food Administration and Nutrition.

The major prepares students for careers in the field of nutrition, food management, and community nutrition, and food sustainability. The major emphasizes the role of nutrition and food in individual and family health, cultural and behavioral influences on food selection, and the management of commercial and noncommercial food systems. The major is offered in three modalities to meet student needs: in-person, hybrid (combination of online and in-person courses), and online. The online major courses will include asynchronous and synchronous formats.
