The honors concentration is being revised in conjunction with revisions to all other concentrations to bring it into alignment with EO 1071. Rather than 3 additional 3 unit upper-division units of the student's choice, we are now requiring only one 3 unit seminar. The requirement to take a 1 unit Honors Thesis course is unaltered. We are also adding GPA requirements which have been enforced since the beginning of the concentration, but which do not appear in the current catalog.
