Catalog Description:

Our proposed credential program is not a degree program, and will run only through the College of Continuing Education because a requirement for enrollment is that the students are hired as practicing teachers. As such, we do not want the program listed in the catalog.

Admission Requirements: Course prerequisites and other criteria for admission of students to the degree major program, and for their continuation in it.

The admission requirements for this CTE program are determined by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing and are as follows:

- 1. Three years of work experience directly related to each industry sector to be named on the credential. One year equals a minimum of 1000 clock hours and the experience may be full-time or part-time, paid or unpaid.
- 2. High school diploma requirement by one of the following methods:
 - a. Possess a high school diploma
 - b. Possess a diploma based on passage of the GED Test
 - c. Possess the foreign equivalent of a high school diploma
- 3. Verification, signed by the Commission-approved program sponsor, that the applicant has been apprised of the requirements for both the preliminary and clear credentials, including the requirements of the program of personalized preparation.
- 4. Completed application
- 5. Completed Live Scan receipt verifying fingerprints have been taken and fees have been paid, unless fingerprint clearance is already on file with the Commission.
