Feminist political thought is a fast-growing area of the landscape of political discourse around the world. This course complements existing courses in political science by providing students an opportunity to understand how feminism impacts the formation and operations of and within political institutions, the shaping and implementation of public policy, and organization and implementation of individual and collective political action. It responds to students' growing interests in feminism and its relevance for politics. This course also reflects the expertise of new faculty and will provide students an opportunity to engage with faculty currently researching in this area.

Introduces students to current and recent feminist political thought. Analyzes ideas and practices central to political institutions, public policy, and both elite and citizen-led political action through multiple feminist political lenses.
