Justification for course proposal:

Students in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSAD) and San Juan Unified SD (SJUSD) are extremely diverse (cde.ca.gov). For 10+ years, the CSAD department has collaborated with SJUSD to train speech-language pathology graduate student interns while they provide services to K-12 students on the autism spectrum (OTAS). During internships, student clinicians target social communication and functional employment skills through individualized treatment plans. This collaboration provides both K-12 and graduate students with needed workforce development skills.

There is a dearth of transitional programs for students OTAS, with many losing services once they turn 21. Because of a significant need for care, many organizations providing personal support services for adults with disabilities experience significant turnover following employee burnout, resulting in fewer services. Creative Living Options (CLO) helps to fill this need by providing individuals with connections for gaining needed workforce skills and a means for positive peer relationships. These desperately needed services address a social justice disparity, ensuring individuals with disabilities are included in all aspects of community social life.

Many undergraduate students in CSAD are intrinsically motivated to work with individuals OTAS. Advisory board feedback from school districts indicated that CSAD students need experience working with students OTAS earlier in their educational careers to increase skill. In 2016-2017, the course CSAD 142: Topics in ASD was revised to include service learning, a high-impact instructional strategy that promotes community engagement and civic responsibility.

This project seeks to place CSAD undergraduate students enrolled in the CSAD 142: Topics in ASD course in a service learning partnership with CLO and local school districts with the goal of improving social communication and workforce development skills via a collaborative peer working relationship. Initial meetings with SJUSD and CLO regarding this collaboration began in Spring of 2017 and Fall of 2021, respectively. This course development was awarded with an Anchor University Priority Grant as well as a Designated Hispanic-Serving Institute Award.
