Justification for course proposal:

First, we are adding PSYC 2 and PSYC 8 as prerequisites, because they will better prepare students for success in the course. Therefore, we are also changing this class to majors and minors only based on the need for prerequisites. Second, as a result of the added prerequisites, we would like to withdraw this course from the GE B5 category since non-majors would be excluded. Third, we are updating the Learning Objectives to better reflect the content and goals of the course as they are taught. However, the focus continues to be on the evolution and biology of human affect, behavior, and cognition (ABC) within specific environmental contexts. It uses biologically oriented techniques (in addition to others), animal models, and human cross-cultural research to test evolution-based hypotheses about ABCs. Fourth, we omitted the word "can" from the course description sentence that says "topics can include", since these topics will always be taught. Finally, we are also updating the semester in which the course will be offered to conform to actual scheduling.

Examination of empirical literature on emotion, behavior, and cognition of individuals from an evolutionary perspective. Topics include: scientific methods in evolutionary psychology, survival strategies, mating strategies, parenting, kinship, cooperation, altruism, aggression, sexual conflict, and social dominance.
