### Justification for course proposal:

The MAT (Single Subject) degree currently offers students in the Single Subject concentration the option to earn a Single Subject teaching credential in various world languages including Spanish, French, and German. We want to offer a new single subject content area in American Sign Language (ASL) as a World Language because our district partners have indicated that there are jobs available for ASL teachers in local high schools, and this is a viable career path for our undergraduate Deaf Studies degree majors. In order to offer this credential, a teaching methodology course is required. We have consulted with the World Language department, who supports this.
