The techniques and concepts covered in this course include capturing, digitizing, manipulating, remixing and presenting images, video and sound in the formation of artworks. "Remix" refers to experimental ways of combining different kinds of media. Projects emphasize experiential outcomes that include installation art, animation, sound, and augmented reality.
