We are changing two GERO courses (100 & 101) to lower division courses (GERO 10 and GERO 11 respectively) through Form A. This changes the prerequisites in other courses. Changes with this program proposal includes changing the prerequisites to the new lower division numbers. Also all done through Form A.

We have also added a new course, GERO 125: Moving towards Equity in California Policy and Practice which will now be included as a choice for majors' Interdisciplinary Elective option.

Additionally ENGL 120S was removed as a major elective, it was inadvertently included as a major elective at some point.
