Name change - FILM 127 Directing for Film replaces FILM 127 Directing and Producing for Television. With the removal of all television studio equipment and curriculum from the program, this course title is outdated and inaccurate. Yet, much of the content re. directing remains.

Course description update - congruent with the shift to film directing.

Removal of cross-listing in COMS - cross-listing courses in the same department causes confusion when students register. Also creates more admin work for faculty and staff when scheduling rooms, grading, posting classes for registration, enforcing caps, and more.

We are in the process of removing all Coms cross-listing from required Film courses for the reasons above and those changes will be reflected in a Form B already in process.

Change of pre-reqs - Making FILM 128 - Intermediate Production - the pre-req improves the sequencing of courses by exposing students to the entire film production process before focusing on the specific area of directing.
