The content and rigor of the previous first course negatively affected enrollment and progression to graduation. The change appropriately levels the content for student success.

Updating objectives and adding four to comply with the California Board of Registered Nursing requirements for the Public Health Nurse Certificate.

This program was approved but has never been offered. It was initially intended to be offered through CCE. Changing from 8-week courses to full semester courses allows this program to be offered stateside and include cross-enrollment students from local community colleges per our Collaborative MOU.

The School of Nursing's Online RN to BSN program at Sacramento State is designed to advance the associate degree RN to the next level in the profession, preparing the graduate BSN for professional leadership roles in society. The Online RN to BSN program will offer students the convenience of going at their own pace through the program, number of units taken, and time to graduation to fit their lives. The program offers an optional Community/Public Health clinical course (NURS 174C). Completion of the full program of study, along with 90 hours of clinical, qualifies students to apply for a Public Health Nurse (PHN) certificate from the California Board of Registered Nursing.

Admission Requirements: Course prerequisites and other criteria for admission of students to the degree major program, and for their continuation in it.

Admission Requirements

- · Prerequisite courses must be completed prior to admission;
- Must possess a current valid California registered nursing license prior to enrolling in NURS 174 or the second term of the RN to BSN program, whichever is first;
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.6 upon completion of qualifying nursing program
- Admission to Sacramento State including official transcripts of all institutions attended;
- Completed RN to BSN online application;
- Program admission is contingent upon meeting health-screening and clearance requirements outlined in the RN to BSN handbook.

Required Pre-admission Courses:

The following classes must have been completed with a grade of "C" or better.

- Anatomy or Anatomy and Physiology I (with a lab)
- · Physiology or Anatomy and Physiology II (with a lab)

- · Statistics
- Critical Thinking
