Justification for course proposal:

Proposed change: Remove PSYC 121 from the list of pre-requisites and replace it with PSYC 8 and 9. PSYC minors were added to the prerequisites. ELOs had not yet been entered in Course Leaf, this change also allows us to enter them into the Course Leaf system. The ELOs have been slightly adjusted for clarity and to more closely align with Bloom's taxonomy, yet maintain the content of the initial ELOs originally proposed in 2015.

Rationale/justification for change: The PSYC 121 pre-requisite is an unnecessary barrier to enrollment in PSYC 142. PSYC 121 promotes students' understanding psychological science research through a project-based experience. Although valuable knowledge, this level of understanding is not necessary for an introduction to Community Psychology. A lower-division introduction to statistics for psychology (PSYC 9) and a lower-division introduction to psychological research methods (PSYC 8) should be sufficient to succeed in PSYC 142. PSYC minors were added so they can use it as an elective class for their minor and the computer will not block them from enrolling.
