## Comprehensive Exam Title: \_\_\_\_\_

The purpose of the comprehensive examination is to evaluate the student's ability to: 1) Apply advanced clinical and theoretical knowledge in nursing, 2) Synthesize and critique research, and 3) Develop a systematic plan for improving nursing practice.

Scoring	Procedure	
1.	Refer to the evaluation criteria for each area.	
2.	Enter the appropriate rating for each criterion. Scores of 4 (good) or 5 (excellent)	
	are needed for an exam to pass. Consistent scoring of a 3 (fair) or below will not yield a passing score.	5=excellent
3.	Obtain final score by: a) Multiplying the area subtotals by the designated weight, and b) Combining the four area totals. There are 500 points possible: I=125,	4=good
	II=150, III=125, and IV=100. The area subtotals, area totals, and total score are calculated automatically.	3=fair
4.	Limit comments to a brief identification of deficits for scores of 3 or below. Type	2=poor
	comments in appropriate sections of grading rubric; do not write any comments on rubric or student's exam.	1=very poor or absent
5.	Check pass or fail on last page. A total of 350 points out of 500 are needed to pass the exam.	
6.	Invalidate the entire examination if there is evidence of plagiarism; score as a zero.
