Committee of the Whole Transfer Degrees Pathways (AB 928)

Discussion continued from the September 22 Faculty Senate meeting.

 Philosophy Department Statement Responding to the Intersegmental Committee of Academic Senates (ICAS) Proposal on AB 928.
Shared per the request of the Philosophy faculty.

The body discussed the recommendation from the Intersegmental Committee of Academic Senates (ICAS) regarding the implementation of AB 928. Concerns about eliminating course requirements in different GE areas, including Area E and Area C, was discussed. A distinction was made between making a decision based on the student curriculum versus impacts to departments and faculty workload. The proposals from the Philosophy Department put forward as alternatives to that from the ICAS were discussed as well as several other proposals. The discussion ended with strategies for having the Senate make a decision between the various proposals. The Senate Chair made a list of the pitched proposals and will send out an email listing them to senators so that they may share them with their units and come back with feedback as to which one is preferred.
