5 6 7	Whereas our colleges and departments are committed to infusing community engagement into many of our curricular and co-curricular opportunities for students; and
8 9 10	Whereas our centers and institutes partner with our broader community to promote cultural and economic growth and innovation in the Sacramento region; and
11 12 13	Whereas our campus continuously strives to meet our high standards for equitable, reciprocal, and mutually beneficial engagement; and
14 15 16 17	Whereas, because of our collective efforts, our campus earned the prestigious elective classification for community engagement from the Carnegie Foundation in 2010, 2015, and 2020; and
18 19 20 21 22	Whereas, in the current re-classification cycle, we have revisited our definition of community engagement, which currently is identical to the Carnegie Foundation's definition, to make it our own; and
23 24 25 26	Whereas, our revised definition is the product of an ongoing collaborative process including review by the Carnegie Re-Classification for Community Engagement Steering Committee, the Anchor University Advisory Committee, the Community Engagement Center, the Division of Inclusive Excellence, and the President's Office; and
27 28 29	Be it resolved that the Faculty Senate for Sacramento State also hereby endorses the following revised definition of community engagement for our campus:
 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38 	At Sacramento State, community engagement refers to reciprocal and collaborative partnerships between our university and diverse communities at local, regional, national, and global levels for the mutually beneficial, equitable, and inclusive exchange of knowledge and resources. The purpose of community engagement at Sacramento State is to enhance teaching and learning; to enrich scholarly and creative activity; to prepare educated, engaged community members; to strengthen democratic values and civic responsibility; to identify and respond to critical societal needs; and to advance social justice and contribute to the public good.
39 40 41 42 43 44 45 46 47 48	 Community engagement at Sacramento State is guided by the following core values: Reciprocal Partnerships: We prioritize reciprocal partnerships characterized by mutual respect and shared decision-making. These partnerships strive for cocreation and co-learning and recognize the unique contributions and perspectives of students, faculty, staff, alumni, and community members. Advancement of Social Justice and the Public Good: Our engagement efforts seek to address critical social issues and contribute to the common good of society. By leveraging the collective resources and expertise of our university and community partners, we work towards promoting equity, justice, and inclusive prosperity for all.

49	• Equity-Oriented Collaboration: We are committed to fostering fair, equitable,
50	and inclusive collaborations that distribute benefits and burdens equitably among
51	all participants and thus reject activities that are exploitative and/or extractive.
52	This commitment to equity also includes ensuring equal access to high-impact
53	engagement opportunities for students, recognizing and valuing the community-
