An interest in interdisciplinary faculty collaboration, revised state program standards, significant changes in the education professionals labor market, and fiscal imperatives have encouraged the faculty in the College of Education to transform the structure and program offerings in the College. As a result, faculty have significantly revised the existing multiple subject credential program, introducing new content, creating new courses, and organizing program components in innovative ways. These changes will offer candidates a more streamlined, focused and coherent program while also providing faculty members with exciting opportunities for collaboration and mutual support. Moreover, the changes integrate important community partners more firmly into program operations and delivery.

## NEW CATALOG DESCRIPTION SHOULD READ:

- The Multiple Subject Teaching Credential (MSTC) authorizes the holder to provide instruction in any self-contained classroom. In practice, the MSTC is held by elementary and early childhood teachers.
- Students who wish to pursue a career in Special Education can earn a Mild/Moderate or Moderate/Severe Specialist Credential (a basic Multiple Subject credential is not a prerequisite but can be earned concurrently).
- The MSTC embeds the English Language Authorization (ELA), which prepares students to work with second language learners.
- A Bilingual Authorization for Spanish or Hmong is also available. Students who seek an added credential authorization to teach in a bilingual setting or in another subject area can obtain information on added authorizations from the Credentials Office in Eureka Hall 209.
