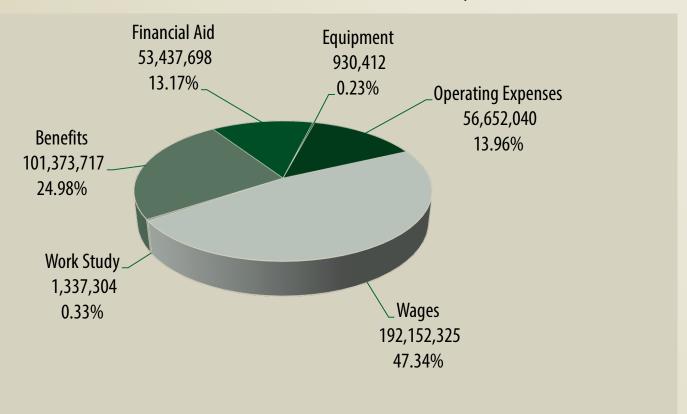


# How Did We Spend the Money in 2019-20?



# How did we spend the money in 2019-20?

#### **TOTAL OPERATING FUND EXPENSES = \$406M**







CSU's requested increase

(Nov 2019)

State Funds (ongoing)

\$563.8M

Tuition (Enrollment Growth)

84.5M

**Total Increase** 

\$648.3M

One-Time Funding

\$500.0M



#### The \$648.3M would have paid for:

- \$105M for 4<sup>th</sup> year of GI 2025
- \$15M for basic needs partnerships
- \$177.4M for salary increases
- \$248.6M for 5% enrollment growth
- \$75M for critical infrastructure
- \$27.3M for mandatory cost increases



Governor's Initial Budget Proposal (January 2020)

State funds (ongoing) \$199M

Summer Fin Aid programs (one-time) \$24M Expand PaCE programs (one-time) \$6M



#### Governor's May Revision Proposal

- \$199M increase is repealed
- \$398M reduction in state funding (ongoing)
- The \$398M could be restored on a one-time basis, if federal assistance received



### CSU 2020-21 Budget

# State Legislature's Proposal (June 15, 2020)

- \$199M increase is restored
- If federal aid is NOT received
  - \$199M increase is repealed
  - \$202M reduction in state funding (ongoing)



CSU Final Budget Agreement (June 22, 2020)

- \$299.1M reduction in state funding (ongoing)
- Reduction could be restored on a one-time basis, if federal aid received by Oct 15<sup>th</sup>.
- \$9M one-time increase in fin aid programs

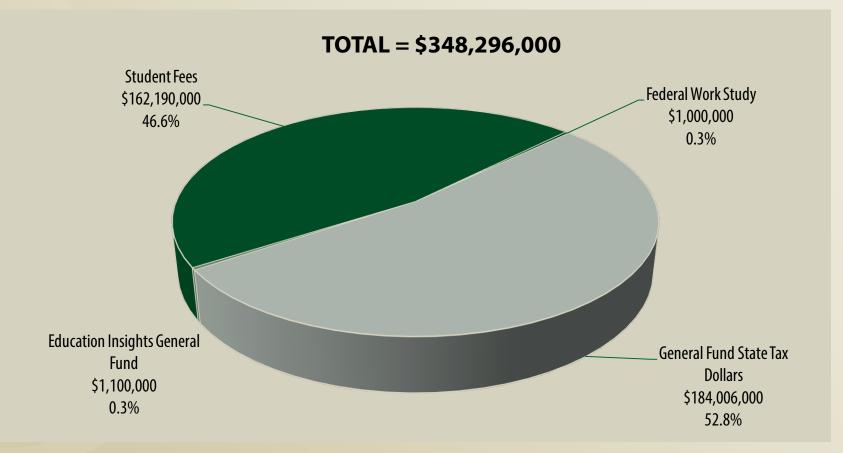

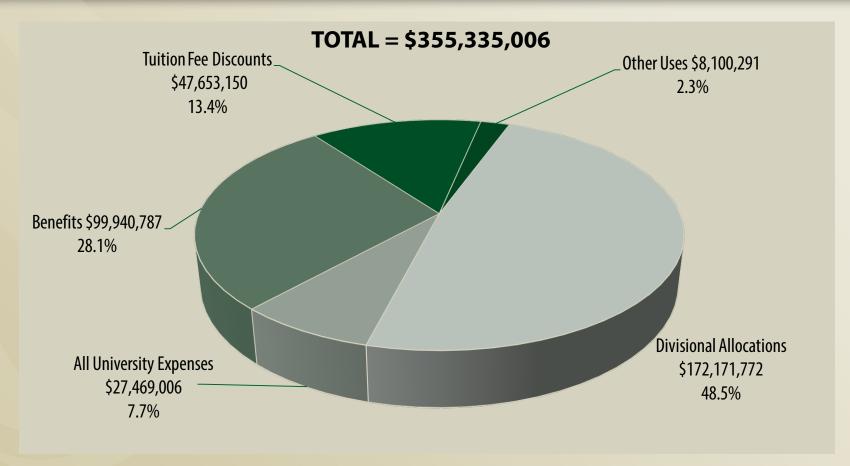


# General Operating Fund – 2020-21 Sources



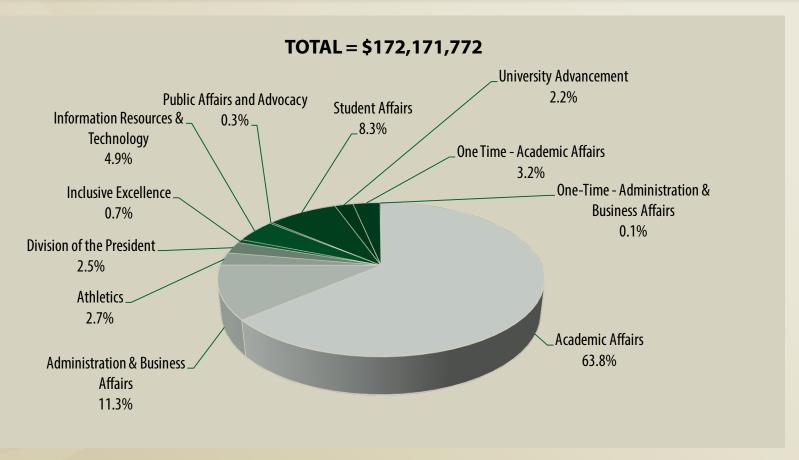


# General Operating Fund – 2020-21 Uses

# Federal Update Nathan Dietrich

### Federal Update

- CARES Act passed in April, included
   \$26.7 billion for higher education nationwide.
- Sacramento State received:
  - \$17.8 million for student emergency aid
  - \$17.8 million for University expenses
  - \$2.6 million as a Minority Serving Institution
- National higher education community is now seeking \$120 billion for colleges and universities



### Federal Update

- Since April there has been a lot of talk and negotiations, but still no second relief bill, now "likely" after the election
  - House Democrats passed the HEROS Act in May (\$3 trillion total), included <u>\$37 billion</u> for higher education
    - Now pushing a \$2 trillion relief bill, still includes at least \$37 billion for higher education
  - Senate Republicans seeking smaller \$500 billion package, including <u>\$29 billion</u> for higher education
  - Trump Administration seeking a bill of roughly \$1.5 trillion(?)

### Awards Categories

Three buckets of money CSU, Sacramento was awarded from the Federal Government:

- CARES I Emergency Grant for Students
- CARES II Institutional
- CARES III Minority Serving Institution (MSI)



#### **Awards Amounts**

 CARES I – Emergency Grant for Students – \$17.8 M

CARES II – Institutional – \$17.8 M

 CARES III – Minority Serving Institution (MSI) – \$2.6 M



#### Awards Deadlines

- CARES I Emergency Grant for Students – April 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021
- CARES II Institutional May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021
- CARES III Minority Serving Institution (MSI) – June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021



#### Distribution of CARES Funds

- Divisions will receive the appropriate CARES funding through the Cabinet approval, and with the consultation with both Budget and Accounting departments.
- The focus on receiving the funding is on the expense, not the revenue, and the emphasis is only on the change (additional costs incurred because of the pandemic).
- The distribution is done on a <u>reimbursement</u> basis.
- The distribution is also dependent on the costs related to the disruption of instruction, and moving to a virtual mode.



#### **CARES Audit**

- The University has a responsibility and an accountability to meet the CARES Act Requirements.
- The University is expected to be audited by the State and Federal Governments.

- Quarterly Reporting to the Department of Education to be publicly posted on our website First reporting is due on October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020 covering the period from the date of the first HEERF grant award through September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

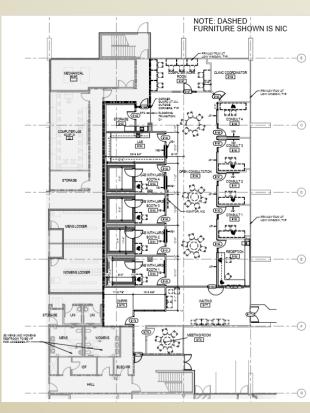

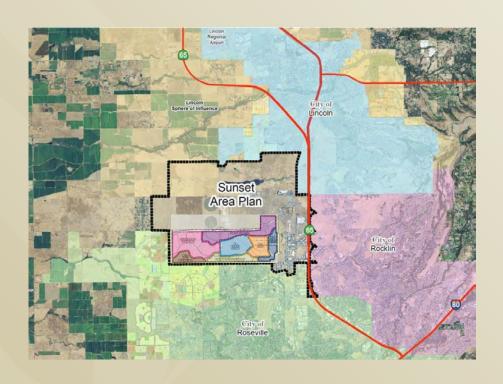
