TOPIC: AB 1887 Travel Ban – New states added – Effective date varies by State

Accounts Payable & Travel (AP) would like to inform you of updates to the University Travel Policy and Procedures effective dates starting on July 1, 2022. Four new state have been added to the Travel Ban.

An update to Assembly Bill 1887 (AB 1887) approved by Attorney General Robert Bonta on June 30, 2022, added to Section 11139.8 of the Government Code relating to discrimination.

As a result of this updated law the CSU is restricted from requiring employees to travel to the additional states. Additionally, CSU is prohibited from approving state-funded or state-sponsored travel to those states.

The effective date of this ban varies by state.

Indiana & Utah (as of July 1, 2022)
Louisiana (as of August 1, 2022)
Arizona (as of September 28, 2022)

Other states under the travel restrictions:

Alabama	Idaho	Kentucky	North Carolina	Oklahoma	Tennessee
Arkansas	Iowa	Mississippi	North Dakota	South Carolina	Texas

The updates reflect the changes to the CSU system wide travel policy and procedures.

Exceptions to the travel prohibitions may be granted (<https://oag.ca.gov/ab1887>). Travelers are required to document any exceptions on their travel request and/or travel expense documentation.

Please be aware University Paid Travel credit cards are **NOT ALLOWED** to be used for any travel to a banned state.
