# What is Centralized Waste?

- Centralized waste collection is a system where trash, recycling, and compost are collected at shared stations in designated locations; such as hallways or building lobbies instead of from individual offices or classrooms



# Why are we doing this



- Improve custodial efficiency
- Decrease landfill overage expenses
- Ensure compliance with SB 1383
- Support campus 2030 Zero Waste goal

# How This Affects You

- Custodial staff will no longer empty individual desk-side trash bins
- You will need to take your waste to a nearby centralized waste station, typically **within 10–20 steps of your workspace.**
- Follow posted signage for proper sorting
