Deadline Friday: Apply for the University Award for Early-Career Faculty

The Research and Creative Activity (RCA) Faculty Senate Subcommittee is extending the deadline for applications for the 2017-18 University Awards for Research, Scholarship, and Creative Activity for Early-Career Faculty. This award is given annually to a faculty member who has made significant contributions to a discipline through research, scholarly activity, creative/artistic endeavors, and publication. The award includes a \$2,500 professional development grant and three units of release time.

Eligible applicants must be tenured or tenure-track faculty within the first 10 years of their appointment and must have been employed at Sacramento State for three of the past five years.

The deadline to apply is 5 p.m. Friday, Jan. 19. Applications must be submitted through InfoReady Review at csus.infoready4.com. For more information and to view the call for applications, go to csus.edu/research/rca.

Patients are examined and treated by students in the Doctor of Physical Therapy program under the supervision of a licensed physical therapist. The clinic is in Folsom Hall 1066.

The Orthopedic Pro Bono Clinic will begin Wednesday, Jan. 31. Appointments are from 11 a.m. to noon or noon to 1 p.m. Wednesdays through May 2. Patients generally are seen for four sessions, including a complete examination, treatment, and home exercise prescription. Scheduling notice: February outage for CSU Data Center move

Do you access CMS applications such as CMS Human Resources (HR/SA), CMS Student Administration (HR/SA), the faculty, employee, or student centers, or the Common Financial System (CFS)? If so, here's an important planning notice. Because of a new long-term contract between the CSU Chancellor's Office and service partner Unisys, the current CSU Data Center in Salt Lake City will migrate to a new state-of-the-art location in the Silicon Valley. Ideally located in California, the new CSU Data Center also has been re-architected to take advantage of new technologies to help control costs and improve performance. The migration will require extended downtime, and to minimize impact to business operations, it is scheduled to occur Saturday, Feb. 3, through Sunday Feb. 4. Deans and/or department chairs oversee the IRA process within their college; they need to ensure concise communication is followed between them and the program advisors per the procedures and guidelines.
