2018 CalPERS Board of Administration state election

Eligible active state members of the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) will have an opportunity to elect the state representative seat on the CalPERS Board of Administration held by Theresa Taylor. The term for this position expires Jan. 15, 2019. The new term begins Jan. 16, 2019, and runs through Jan. 15, 2023. The incumbent has declared her intention to be a candidate for reelection. CalPERS state members active as of July 1, 2018, are eligible to vote in this election. If a runoff is needed, CalPERS state members active as of Oct. 1, 2018, are eligible to vote in the runoff election. The Notice of Election (Notice), which outlines the procedures for becoming a candidate and the election schedule of dates and activities, can be found at calpers.ca.gov.

Catastrophic leave donation

Sacramento State employees may voluntarily donate up to a maximum of 40 hours of sick or vacation leave credits in one-hour increments each fiscal year to another employee who

has been deemed eligible for catastrophic leave. Bargaining Units 1, 10 and 11 may donate only up to 16 hours per fiscal year.
