Daily parking permit increase effective July 1

Effective Sunday, July 1, the daily parking permit rate will increase to \$7 per day and \$4 for a two hour-permit. Daily permit rates have remained constant since 2009. Additional revenue will be used to offset cost increases for maintenance and operation of campus parking facilities.

Permits for students, managers (MPP) and other unrepresented employees will not increase this fiscal year. The student semester permits will remain \$174 and Residence Hall student permits will be \$226. The MPP monthly permit cost will remain \$51 monthly. Other administrator permits will remain the same as the previous year as well. Permit costs for faculty and staff are set by their respective bargaining unit contracts.

University Transportation and Parking Services, which administers the parking program, is by law a self-supporting unit that receives no funding from the state. UTAPS' sole source of revenue for operations, construction and maintenance of parking facilities is from the sale of parking permits. For more information, visit csus.edu/utaps.

The University will host a summer blood drive, 10 a.m.-3 p.m. today, June 18, on Serna Plaza between the University Union and Hornet Bookstore. Participants will receive a California State Fair ticket or a \$10 Fandango movie voucher.

Blood donation saves the lives of accident victims, surgery patients, cancer patients and many others in need. Donating blood is safe, easy and takes about an hour. Sac State

faculty and staff are eligible for a "Fast Track" pass, which expedites the check-in process. Blood donors must weigh 110 pounds or more, be in overall good health and age 17 or older, 16 with a signed BloodSource parental consent form. The blood drive is open to students, faculty, staff and the public. Be sure to eat and hydrate prior to donating. The event is co-sponsored by BloodSource and Associated Students Inc., the Green Army, the Hornet Bookstore, the University Union, The WELL, and Student Health and Counseling Services.

Catastrophic leave donation

Sacramento State employees may voluntarily donate up to a maximum of 40 hours of sick or vacation leave credits in one-hour increments each fiscal year to another employee who has been deemed eligible for catastrophic leave.
