**University chosen for research project to improve adult Latino student outcomes**

Sacramento State has been selected as one of 15 Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs) contributing to a national research project to better serve adult students (25 years old and older). The Council for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL), in partnership with Excelencia in Education, launched the three-year project to improve outcomes for the growing population of adult Latino students. The research gets underway in October with a campus-wide survey.

Faculty, staff and students over age 25 will receive an online survey that will assess the needs of adult learners in areas such as advising, scheduling and financial aid. The research will examine how well they are supported, identify areas for improving services and provide professional development for staff through the CAEL Adult Learner 360 Academy. "Fewer than one in four Latino adults has a college degree," said Excelencia in Education CEO Deborah A. Santiago. "The opportunity to partner with CAEL and institutions committed to improve their efforts with Latino adult students advances our shared national goals of accelerating Latino student success for a better educated workforce and citizenry." *Submitted by the College of Continuing Education*

**Fall 2018 Faculty Research Incentive Grants applications deadline is today**

The purpose of Faculty Research Incentive Grant (FRIG) program is to provide an incentive for faculty to write a grant proposal for external funding, encouraging research, scholarly and/or creative activity at Sacramento State. Faculty members must identify a specific grant solicitation or a formal request for proposals to which they are interested in submitting a proposal. For this FRIG cycle, the grant's submission deadline must be between Jan. 1 and July 31, 2019.

This program is open to all tenured and tenure-track faculty, and lecturers with multiyear appointments of at least 0.5 time base. Applications may be submitted for individual or collaborative projects. Upon submission of the external grant proposal, faculty may choose to receive \$2,500 in additional employment, \$2,500 in professional development funds or one WTU of release time (shared if there are co-PIs).
