The Research and Creative Activity (RCA) Faculty Senate Subcommittee invites applications for the 2018-19 University Awards for Research, Scholarship, and Creative Activity for Early-Career and Senior Faculty. These annual awards are given to faculty members who have made significant contributions to their disciplines through research, scholarly activity, creative/artistic endeavors and publication. Each award includes a \$2,500 professional development grant and three units of release time from the Office of Research, Innovation, and Economic Development.

Applicants eligible for the Early-Career award must be tenured or tenure-track faculty within the first 10 years of their appointment and must have been employed at Sacramento State for at least three years. The Senior award is open to all faculty who have held a tenured or tenure-track position at Sacramento State for at least 10 academic years.

David Andersen-Rodgers to deliver SSIS/AI-Qazzaz Dean's Lecture on Nov. 14

Professor David Andersen-Rodgers, Department of Political Science, gives the Fall 2018 SSIS/AI-Qazzaz Dean's Lecture at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 14, in the University Union, Forest Suite (second floor). His topic is "Human Security is Dead! Long Live Human Security! Norms, Rights, and Human Protection in an Age of Rage." Human security is the idea that the security of individuals and communities should receive priority in policymaking decisions. Displacement, conflict-induced famine, global climate change and a rise in nativist movements has challenged the once emerging human security norm. Professor Andersen-Rodgers will discuss themes from his recently published book (co-authored with Kerry F. Crawford) *Human Security: Theory and Action*. Light refreshments will be served.
