When to apply online:

Spring Semester

If finishing computer literacy/lower division courses by the end of the previous Summer, the application will be available September 1.

Supplemental online business application due:

October 15

Fall Semester

If finishing computer literacy/lower division courses by the end of the previous Fall, the application will be available February 1.

Supplemental online business application due:

March 15
