AWARENESS OF SEX TRAFFICKING IN THE SACRAMENTO COUNTY

The Institute for **Social Research**

at Sacramento State polled 1,187 residents in Sacramento County to better understand residents' awareness of sex trafficking.

This poll was conducted in May 2022 in coordination with a study on Estimating the Prevalence of Sex Trafficking in Sacramento County*. The prevalence study estimates there were 13,079 sex trafficking victims in Sacramento County between 2015 and 2020.

Sex-trafficking involves the exploitation of people through force, fraud, coercion, threat, and/or deception for the purposes of engaging them in commercial sex work. This poll confirms that sex trafficking in Sacramento County is largely hidden from the public's awareness. Sacramento residents showed a general awareness of the issue, however they report knowing little to nothing about sex trafficking in their county.

Even though Sacramento residents report little knowledge of sex trafficking within their county, they demonstrate a general awareness and understanding of the issue.
