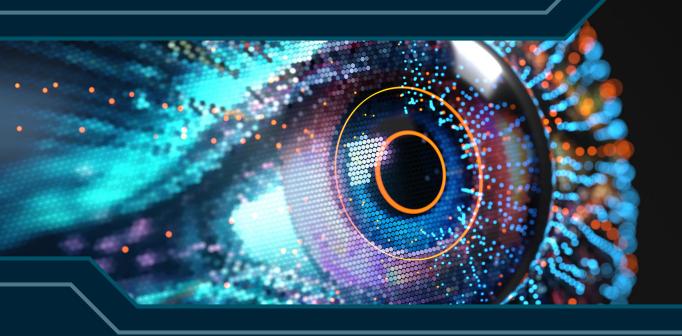
18th Annual CRC-CPPE Fall Ethics Symposium:
