2022 BAZZANELLA LITERARY AWARDS

COMPETITION RULES CSU, SACRAMENTO, DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

All students currently enrolled at CSU, Sacramento during Spring 2022 are eligible to enter. Though there is no minimum unit requirement, students **CANNOT** be auditing courses; students must have a matriculated classified status of either graduate or undergraduate.

The competition will be separated between graduate and undergraduate students determined by their Spring 2022 class standing. Within their particular class standing, students may enter more than one category but may submit only **one** entry in a particular category. Manuscripts must be original work by the author and must not have been published or have won a prize in a previous literary contest.

CATEGORIES

- POETRY
- CRITICAL ANALYSIS
- SHORT FICTION
- CREATIVE NONFICTION

PRIZES

- The first-place prize in each category will be \$200.
- The second-place prize in each category will be \$100.
- First and second place winning entries in each category will be published.

Prose manuscripts should be typed, double spaced with 1" margins, and must have a title on the top of the first page. Poetry may be single spaced. Do not include a separate title page. Pages must be compiled in a single PDF **and** a Word document. The maximum number of words for the **Short Fiction** category is 6000 (approx. 20 pages typed doubled spaced) and for the Critical Analysis and Creative Nonfiction categories the maximum number is 5000 (approx. 16 pages typed double spaced), not counting bibliography and footnotes. Manuscripts which exceed the maximum length will not be forwarded to the judges. The category identified as "Critical Analysis" is restricted to essays which analyze a work of art such as novels, poetry, essays, film, music, or some other aesthetic medium. Essays not analyzing an art work should be submitted under the creative nonfiction category. Students may submit only one poem in the Poetry category. Submissions of "prose poetry" and/or "flash fiction" may be entered in one category only. The Coordinators reserve the right to change to a different category an entry which, in their opinion, has been submitted incorrectly. The Awards Committee also reserves the right to not award prizes in every category.

You will also need to submit your entry in a single PDF AND a Word document (using 12 pt Times New Roman font. (Submissions in other formats will not be considered).

Manuscripts are to be submitted to English@csus.edu by 12:00 noon on Friday, March 4, 2022. Late entries will not be accepted. Please add in the subject line "Bazzanella Submission – First name, Last name."

Please read carefully: Manuscripts that do not conform to these guidelines will not be considered.

You will submit three things with each entry:

1. Manuscript in Single PDF and Word document (see below for information)
2. Submission Form (see below for information)
3. Contact Information (see below for information)

Your manuscript should:

- Have a title at the top of the first page
- Organized in a single PDF and a separate Word document
- Have the pages numbered
- Be double spaced with 1" margins
- Use Times New Roman 12 pt. font
- **Not** contain your name (anywhere)

Your submission form (separate PDF) should state the following:

- Title of manuscript
- Category (Poetry, Short Fiction, Critical Analysis, or Creative Non-Fiction)
- Your graduate or undergraduate level

Contact Information (separate PDF) should state the following:

- Full Name
- Address
- Telephone number
- E-mail address
- Student ID (MUST include this as it is the only way a check can be awarded)
- Your graduate or undergraduate level
- Title of manuscript and category
- **AND the type of computer program you used**

Please compile an email with each of these uploaded PDFs and Word document: three (3) total, plus one (1) Word document.

Entries should be submitted to the English Department via English@csus.edu. There is a separate judge for each of the four categories. The judges are not members of the current Staff or Faculty of Sacramento State. The judges' decisions are final.

Winners will be notified by phone in early April. We will publish first and second place winning entries in the yearly Bazzanella booklet. If you do not want your entry published, you should not enter it in this contest. All submissions (via email and PDF) will be kept until September 30, 2022 and then discarded.
