Requirements for catalog years 2020 and later

TOTAL UNITS REQUIRED FOR MAJOR: 44

- English majors take ENGL 120A instead ENGL 20/20M.
- English majors must complete eighteen (18) units of English, of which at least fifteen (15) units must be upper-division courses (ENGL 100-199) in residence at Sacramento State.
- Up to six (6) units of ENGL 195 or ENGL 199 may be included in the upper-division elective units.
- The following courses may not be included toward the major: ENGL 1, 1C, 1X, 2, 2X, 3, 3M, 5, 5M, 10, 10M, 11, 11M, 20, 20M, 60, 60M, 85, 86, 87, 109M, 109W, or 109X.
- English majors must earn a grade of C- or higher in all courses included in the major, unless otherwise specified.
- Three (3) units in an upper-division literature course from another academic department may be included.
- English majors who need a 1-unit course may sign up for ENGL 120X MLA and APA Style Guides or for ENGL 121: Writing Center Tutoring. To enroll in 121, please visit the University Reading and Writing Center (CLV 128) by the second week of the semester. ENGL 121 may be taken twice for credit.
