Kim Abeles: Smog Collectors, 1987-2020 - University Library Gallery

Los Angeles-based artist Kim Abeles makes art about pollution from pollution. Presenting the first in-depth survey of Abeles' Smog Collectors series, the exhibition features over thirty years of her artistic investigations related to the environmental impact caused by airborne particulates.

10:30am - 11:30am Barry Underwood Artist Presentation - Tahoe 1026

Artist presentation including a slideshow sharing his photographic work and process. Barry Underwood's creative practice stands at the intersection of staged photography, land art, and minimalist sculpture. Using the landscape as a stage and the intrusions as the players, Underwood's light installations trace what has happened on a site. Shapes, lines, discordant colors, and diagrammatic perspectives are made vivid with electroluminescent wire or LEDs.

1:00pm - 2:00pmDr. Persis Karim "Against Erasure: Women, Art, and the Tide of Iranian
Resistance" - Forest Suite, Student Union

In this presentation, Dr. Karim will explore how women's writing and art help ground the struggle for women's rights, human rights, and global resistance to patriarchal authority in the context of the protests in Iran that have been ongoing on since the brutal beating and death of Mahsa Jina Amini. Dr. Karim is an award-winning scholar, artist, and poet, and currently serves as the Neda Nobari Chair of the newly established Center for Iranian Diaspora Studies at SFSU.
