The **Sacramento Saturday Club** was organized on December 9, 1893. It is the oldest musical organization in Sacramento – and one of the oldest west of the Rockies.

When established in 1893, the Sacramento Saturday Club's fundamental mission was to promote and sustain the Sacramento area's need and love for the greatest of the arts — music. It does this by providing monthly concert performances in member's homes and supporting developing young musicians.

The Sacramento Saturday Club raises and awards scholarship money to the area's talented music students, both instrumental and vocal, with the goal of furthering their musical careers. It also provides ample opportunities for its members to meet fellow lovers of music, listeners and performers alike, on a social level.

Annual scholarships for promising young musicians are given by the club to students of California State University, Sacramento as well as other area schools. Tonight's recital features the most recent winners of those scholarships.

Mason Rogers is an active young trumpeter in Northern California, who in his short career has performed across the Western United States in solo, chamber, and orchestral settings. Mason has studied with prominent trumpeters such as Ronald Romm, Chris Coletti, Mike Rocha, David Hickman, David Dash, Ari Micich, and John Marchiando, who have each contributed their unique style to Mason's musical formation.

Quinn Vance, piano, is a second-semester music major at American River College, studying under Steinway Artist Dr. Natsuki Fukasawa since October 2021. He began playing piano at the age of 4, first being taught at the historical Victorian Pease Conservatory of Music in Sacramento under Ms. Margie Curler. Although Quinn enjoys a variety of music genres, his passion is Classical piano. Some of his notable achievements include reaching third place at the 2023 Ruby Holland Foundation's International Music Competition; being awarded a private masterclass with concert pianist and composer Frederic Voorn, from Amsterdam; being awarded a scholarship by the American Guild of Organists which provided him with a year of organ lessons under Dr. Ryan Enright; and recently being hailed as one of the winners of the 2024 American River College Concerto Aria competition. Quinn has an eclectic array personal interests which includes composing music, cooking, bread making, and painting. Quinn plans to pursue his bachelor's degree in music at California State University, Sacramento and plans to be a lifelong learner of classical music.
