Steve Perdicaris serves as Lecturer in Music, Trombone at Sacramento State and is a member of the Sacramento Philharmonic & Opera. He previously served on the faculties of the University of Nevada-Reno and the University of the Pacific Conservatory of Music in Stockton, CA. Steve has performed with the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra (England), the Houston Symphony, and many northern California orchestras. He can also be heard on numerous recordings with Sir Simon Rattle and the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra (EMI label). Steve has worked under conductors such as Andre Previn, Leonard Slatkin, and Robert Shaw, and with many headliners including Tony Bennett, Sammy Davis Jr., and the Manhattan Transfer. This past summer, he performed with the William Cramer Memorial Trombone Choir at the International Trombone Festival in London, Ontario, Canada. This ensemble was made up of trombone professors from throughout Canada, the U.S., and Latin America. In 2018, Steve received the Alumni Enterprise Award from the Music Academy of the West (Santa Barbara) for his after-school music program for underserved children in San Francisco's Mission District. Steve received his Bachelor of Music degree from the University of North Texas, Master of Nonprofit Administration degree from the University of San Francisco and was awarded an Associate Certificate with Honors in Trombone Performance from the Royal College of Music in London. Additional studies include the Los Angeles Philharmonic Institute and the Music Academy of the West.

Russ Zokaites serves as Professor of Trombone and Euphonium at Fresno State University. Performance credits include recording the Fuchs Bass Trombone Concerto with the United States Army Band "Pershing's Own" and performances with the Dayton Philharmonic, Kentucky Symphony, Bergan Philharmonic (Norway), and The Netherlands Symphony Orchestra. He has collaborated with over 20 composers including Grammy Award winning Kenneth Fuchs, American Prize winner Martin Hebel, and Inez McComas. His solo album is published by Centaur Records and is available through Naxos. Russ was a Fellow at the 2013 Alessi Seminar hosted by Joseph Alessi of the New York Philharmonic. He was a featured soloist at the 2021 and 2019 American Trombone Workshops and gave full recitals at the 2018, 2019, and 2025 International Trombone Festival. Russ holds degrees from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, University of South Carolina, and ArtEZ Hogeschool voor de kunsten (NL).
