

College of Business Administration Undergraduate Business Advising Center Business Administration Minor Effective Fall 2021

A minor consisting of 26 units is offered in the field of Business Administration for the student <u>not</u> majoring in Business Administration. A student wishing to minor in Business Administration must file a minor request petition (obtain in the Undergraduate Business Advising Center). At least nine (9) upper division units must be taken in residence. Business internships (195) and Special Problems (199) will <u>not</u> count for credit towards the minor.

Lower division courses must be completed prior to being admitted to the minor and taking upper division business courses. To earn a minor in Business Administration, a student must have a minimum 2.0 ("C" average) grade point average in the courses presented for the minor, with a minimum acceptable grade for any course being a "C-".
