- Minimum GPA to <u>apply</u> is 2.4, however, this does not guarantee admission to the program. Actual GPA cut-offs have been higher.
- GPA cutoffs for the past few semesters have been in the 2.80/3.00 range.
- All lower division requirements must be completed at the time of application.
- The number of students admitted to the major each semester will vary depending on faculty resources.

Spring Semester

If finishing computer literacy/lower division courses by the end of the previous Summer, the application will be available September 1.

October 15

March 15
