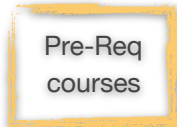

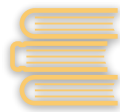
Additional pre-reqs: All credential programs require a 2.67 GPA or 2.75 in last 60 semester units, Basic Skills requirement, minimum 45 hours of experience, 2 references, essay, background check, TB test, and interview. All programs except ECSE also require subject matter competency.

All programs have a field placement coordinator that secures fieldwork sites for candidates.

Master of Arts in Teaching (**MAT**)  
(can continue after credential for 1 more year)

Federal student loans, Cal & Pell grants, TEACH grant, Sac State College of Ed scholarships, Teacher Residency scholarship.

Intern option in last semester for select candidates.



Master of Arts in Special Education Teaching (**MASET**)  
(can continue after credential for 1 more year)

Federal student loans, Cal & Pell grants, TEACH grant, Sac State College of Ed scholarships, Yolo Teacher Residency scholarship (more than \$16,000), school district scholarships, I-Team scholarship for mod/sev.

Intern option, part-time option, ECSE Added Authorization (3 semesters)

Intern option, part-time option, Dual Multiple Subject program, ACT pathway

Intern option, part-time option, Dual Multiple Subject program

All programs include the English Learner Authorization. All special education programs include the Autism Spectrum Authorization. Bilingual Authorization in Spanish or Hmong can be added to any program.

## Cohorts begin every fall

### General Ed applications due Feb 1. Special Ed applications due April 1.

2-step application process: (1) submit the Cal State Apply application, then (2) submit the Supplemental Application.
