Minimum Admission Requirements

Admission as a classified graduate student in Higher Education Leadership requires:

- A baccalaureate degree;
- A minimum 2.5 GPA in the last 60 units;

- Proficiency in written composition as demonstrated by the submission of a writing sample (essay, prompt provided) with the application package; and,
- Successful interview with faculty, demonstrating:
 - o Preparation for graduate level study
 - o Professional experience at any level in higher education
 - Some leadership experience
 - Familiarity with current issues in education
 - o Knowledge of conflict resolution and negotiation skills
 - o Knowledge of higher education as a field
 - o Entry level understanding of ethical leadership
 - Vision for P-16 education

Applicants who have deficiencies in admission requirements that can be removed by specified additional preparation may be admitted with conditionally classified graduate status. Any deficiencies will be noted on a written response to the student's admission application.

Admission Procedures

Each applicant must submit the following:

- A resume or curriculum vitae highlighting relevant experience;
- A Personal Statement (maximum 500 words) that addresses:
 - Your experiences or the factors that led you to apply for the program;
 - The leadership characteristics you believe you possess;
 - Those personal characteristics you believe you possess that will enable you to be successful in the program; and
 - Your professional interests
- Essay
 - Prompt: Describe your ultimate objective(s) in higher education leadership. What steps do you plan to take to achieve these objectives?
 - Maximum 250 words
- Two recommendations; and
- One set of official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended, other than Sacramento State; official electronic transcripts sent directly from colleges/universities to gradtranscripts@csus.edu or official hard copy transcripts sent directly from colleges/universities to:
