AT THE CENTER FOR COUNSELING AND DIAGNOSTIC SERVICES

The Sacramento State Language and Literacy Clinic provides diagnostic literacy assessment of pre-kindergarten children, school-age children, and adults.

Informal and comprehensive assessments of reading, spelling, and writing are used to identify literacy levels, reading readiness, reading fluency, reading comprehension, writing, spelling, and word recognition issues.

Assessments and evaluations investigate letter knowledge, phonemic awareness, decoding, fluency, and comprehension. After assessment, families/clients receive a written report and recommendations for next steps.

This unique laboratory setting offers master's students unparalleled opportunities for learning and research.
