CSUS Financial Aid

Most of you are not eligible for “regular” university financial aid this summer because your program hasn’t **officially** started yet...

For summer CCE fees, an option is SchoolsFirst Credit Union for a loan to become a teacher

SchoolsFirst Credit Union

- ❖ You are eligible to join this credit union as a future teacher
- ❖ SchoolsFirst offers a loan for tuition, fees, books, etc. called a Special Curriculum Loan
- ❖ For a Special Curriculum loan, you must complete this form.
- ❖ When the form asks for “Student’s Cost of Attendance (COA) for the period of enrollment covered by the loan” for SUMMER that amount is \$12,842.
- ❖ Your “estimated financial assistance” = 0

SchoolsFirst Credit Union

- ❖ To start the process, phone SchoolsFirst 800-462-8328 ext 6557 or go into a SchoolsFirst branch
- ❖ It takes about 3 days from applying to receiving the \$\$
- ❖ Current APR is 5% with up to 5 years (60 months) term
- ❖ Can borrow up to \$15,000 BUT recommend you borrow **NO MORE THAN CSUS Cost Of Attendance** which is **\$12,842**
- ❖ You will need to upload a copy of your unofficial transcript to prove you are in a credential program; or ask me for a letter to submit (email me)

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- ❖ Complete your FAFSA ASAP if you haven't already!
- ❖ Apply as an “**Other undergraduate, (junior or beyond)**”
- ❖ If you selected Master's student, then you need to correct the application
- ❖ Screenshot of how your FAFSA should look is on the next slide

California Dream Act Application (CADAA)

❖ **DACA, Undocu-students CADAA rather than FAFSA; apply ASAP if haven't yet**

❖ **ARE** eligible for CA state aid & COE scholarships

❖ Eligible for the AB 540 CA Grant

❖ If you have resided in CA for over 1 year + 1 day, you can indicate you are a CA resident

Pell & Cal Grant Funding

- ❖ If received Pell funds as an undergrad, you MAY be eligible for another year while in the credential program.
 - ❖ Pell is determined by Fin Aid; check your FA package in your Student Center
- ❖ If you received Cal Grant as an undergrad, AND completed your BA in spring 2025 or **later**, you MAY be eligible for one additional year of support:
 - ❖ Apply directly with the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) for the Cal Grant
 - ❖ NOTE: if you already have the SUG (State University Grant) you can't also have the Cal Grant

TEACH Grant

About \$3700 this year

Must have **cumulative GPA 3.25 or above**

TEACH Grant requires service obligation

- Service Obligation = teach for 4 years within 8 years after finishing the credential, in your high-needs area, in a low-income public school
- If you don't complete the service obligation, the TEACH Grant will be converted to a **loan** that you must repay, with interest.

TEACH Grant Process at Sac State

- You don't apply! (the first set of names were sent to FA in May; GPA is being recalculated at end of summer 2026 for those without GPA at or above 3.25)
- Check Student Center "to do" list;
 - TEACH Grant Counseling is required first
 - Then you sign the TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS)
- FA enrolls you in TEACH Grant Program, which takes another 2 weeks
- FA disburses TEACH Grant Funds usually in 4th week of semester
- YOU MUST submit verification to TEACH Grant EACH year you teach until you complete the service requirement

Golden State Teacher Grant

- There will be 800 grants awarded to SPED candidates across California; up to \$20k each
- Sign up for more info [at this link](#); [application](#) will open in July (not open yet!)
- **Must** have completed the FAFSA or Dream Act Application
- Interns are NOT eligible
- Mercedes will email ALL of you when the application opens

Golden State Teacher Grant

Service Obligation = you must teach for 4 years within 8 years after finishing the credential, in a priority school

If you don't complete the service obligation, the grant must be repaid

Golden State Teacher Grant Process at Sac State

- Apply as SOON as the application opens (probably July)!
- FA begins certifying eligibility; takes 2-4 weeks
- Check your email! California Student Aid Commission sends notice of a Service Agreement to sign on their website.
- \$\$ sent to Sac State in 6-8 weeks; check your Sac State email!
 - Fall – SOONEST you may get \$\$ is late September
 - Spring – SOONEST you may get \$\$ is late February
- \$\$ MAY go to repay loans in your FA package rather than come to you as cash, IF your package includes loans

Student Teacher Stipend Program

\$10,000 STSP is a new program in California for future teachers

- YOU don't apply; we work with your student teaching district; the district submits an application to CTC for you
- You CANNOT be a teacher of record and also receive the STS; (i.e. no teacher interns, no teaching on a PIP/STSP credential)
- Not all local districts are participating in this program; if awarded, your check comes from the district straight to you (not through FA).

CSU Residency Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarships; CSUS will probably award 20-25 of these

Scholarship award criteria for applicants:

1. Interest in teaching English learners, earning a bilingual credential, teaching in urban or high-need schools, or **supporting students with special needs**;
2. Must have Financial need as determined by the campus Financial Aid Office;
3. Enrolled in an approved CSU residency program (Multiple Subject, Single Subject, Education Specialist, or PK-3) during the semester of the awarded scholarship; NOT an INTERN (intern teachers are not eligible)!
4. Good academic standing
5. When the application opens, **Mercedes in TCRED will email ALL of you!**

If you have quit your job or reduced hours...

❖ LOSS OF INCOME:

- ❖ The amount you are awarded in your FA package is based on your FAFSA/ **PRIOR salary**;
- ❖ If you will work less or quit your job for the credential program, you can submit an APPEAL for Loss of Income by using the [Loss of Income Appeal](#) process
- ❖ If you are a dependent & your parents have lost income, you can also file the appeal at the link for THEIR loss
- ❖ Follow ALL steps listed at the link above ASAP to file your appeal!

You MAY be eligible for a Budget Increase

BUDGET INCREASE: You can qualify for additional student loan amounts for specific reasons using a [Budget Increase Appeal form](#) (form will be available in mid-September) for the following:

- Safety-related car expenses up to \$2000 for the vehicle used for transportation to/from school (repairs must happen after fall semester starts; keep receipts)
- Health insurance premiums and/or medical, dental, or vision expenses up to \$4000 which are not covered by insurance
- Child-care expenses up to \$4000 for your children up to age 12
- \$1500 for one-time purchase of a computer

Crisis Assistance & Resource Education Support

- ❖ CalFresh Application Assistance
- ❖ Childcare Grant – if selected, up to \$1k/month
- ❖ Emergency Grant – emergency childcare costs, housing, utilities, food, transportation (including gas to campus)
- ❖ Emergency Housing Services
- ❖ Basic Needs Resource Center – the Well 1031, make an appt up to once/week for food & non-food items

Consider Substitute Teaching

- ❖ There are guidelines for subbing during the credential program (check with your program handbook first)

Federal Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program

- ❖ Teach for 5+ years in low-income school
- ❖ Can forgive up to \$17,500 if your primary responsibility is to provide special education to children with disabilities
- ❖ Additional loan forgiveness programs you may be eligible for can be found by googling “teacher loan forgiveness”

NEXT STEPS!

1. Submit [FAFSA](#) or [CADAA](#) if not already submitted
2. Join [SchoolsFirst](#) & apply for a summer loan if necessary
3. Apply for [Cal Grant](#) if eligible
4. Check your CSUS FA package for [TEACH grant](#)
5. Sign up for information [on Golden State Teacher Grant](#) & apply in July if interested
6. Apply for CSU Residency Scholarship once app opens
7. Submit [Budget Increase](#) (September) and/or [Loss of Income](#) (July) forms if appropriate
8. Check out [CARES office](#) at Sac State
9. [Apply to CTC](#) for 30-day Sub Permit if interested
10. [Apply on EdJoin](#) to be a substitute teacher if interested
