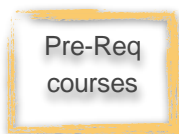

Additional pre-reqs: All credential programs require a 2.5 GPA or 2.75 in last 60 semester units, Basic Skills requirement, minimum 45 hours of experience, 2 references, essay, background check, TB test, and interview. All programs except ECSE also require subject matter competency.
