The camp will be **fully online** via Zoom and Google Classroom due to COVID-19. This camp provides secondary school teachers training and professional development in cybersecurity and its related pedagogy. Camp participants will be part of a teaching community to learn, develop and deliver security content in the K-12 classroom.

Features of the 2021 Teacher Camp

- Instruction by Computer Science and Education professors from Sacramento State
- Integration of fundamental theory and hands-on practice (with fun)
- Strong K-12 pedagogical education and support
- Virtual instruction with strong in-camp support for class engagement
- Post-camp support, advice and professional development
- Each participant will receive a stipend to compensate their time and costs participating
- Each participant will receive three Continuing Education Units (CEU) for participating

Eligibility and Logistics

All camp participants must reside in the United States and be **teachers at a middle school or high school in the United States**. STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) teachers are preferred, but teachers in other disciplines are also considered. As this camp is **fully online, participants will need to have access to a laptop/PC and Internet that is fast enough to support distance learning**. Space is limited. When the camp is full, applicants will be placed on a waiting list and will be notified when a spot becomes available.
